#### Pastor's Message

In the Book of Exodus we read, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob" (3:6). Very early on in the Bible, God reveals to his chosen people his identity, that is, he reveals who he is. When our spiritual ancestors became clear about God's identity, they also became clearer about their own identity, that is, who they are as the people of God. The same principle applies to us today. As we become clear about who God is, we also become clearer about who we are both as individual Christians, but also as the church. From identity follows mission. God has a mission, and we have a mission as well.

During this transition time in the life of Bethesda Lutheran Church, we will enter a process of reflecting on our identity and mission. Getting clearer about identity and mission will assist the congregation, especially the call committee, to be clearer of the kind of pastor that will be needed to support the congregation's mission.

Consequently, for our midweek Lenten services, we will reflect on our identity as individual Christians and as a congregation by reflecting on Luther's *Small Catechism*. The overall theme is "I Believe". To believe is much more than to agree to certain doctrines or teachings. As Martin Luther used that term, *to believe is to trust in God*.

#### Mission

#### External/community audit

Meetings with community leaders, e.g. the mayor, school officials, police, business owners, charities, other non-members.

This is a time to listen and assess what we will hear will affect our understanding of the community that we serve.

These should be done before the summer.

Mission Exploration Team (MET) — I would like to gather a team of four to six persons to assist me in engaging the congregation in this discernment process. They would help to facilitate the History Event, the cottage meetings, and the external/community audit. They would also help to collate the findings and write a final report. The Mission Exploration Team is not the call committee. However, one or two members could also be on the call committee in order to make sure that the conclusions of the discernment process are reflected in the work of the call committee. The MET will also prepare the Mission Site Profile (MSP), and when finished, they will pass that on to the Saint Paul Area Synod.

<u>Call Committee</u> -- The call committee will begin its work as the discernment process about identity and mission concludes. That will likely be towards the summer. They will need to review the documents produced by the discernment process, and then begin to prioritize what attributes and skills will be needed in a new pastor to support the mission of the congregation. As the interim pastor, I will help the call committee to get started, along with synod staff. Having done that, then I will step back and let the call committee do its work. It is unethical for an interim pastor to try to influence a call committee as they seek to identify and recommend a pastoral candidate to the congregation.

To my brothers and sisters in Christ,

Per your request at the February 5, 2017 Annual Budget Meeting, attached you will find a copy of the letter I sent out last August regarding the Deficit Task Force, their recommendations and the actions the council was taking on their recommendations.

Here is an update to the actions we have taken:

- 1. We did refinance our mortgage at a lower interest rate.
- 2. Gary has worked on refining designated and undesignated memorials.
- 3. We have hired a youth director, Jacob Backman.
- 4. The SALT group "Food For Friends" has been started as an outreach ministry of sharing God's Contagious Love, one meal at a time.
- 5. A team was formed with Dave Hohle, Chet DeSchane, and Nathan Schussler to pursue the ideas and possibilities for the land development questions. None of which were feasible for Bethesda at this time.
- 6. Members were contacted and email addresses obtained in order to email the Bell Echoes each month instead of spending money for printing and mailing.
  - 7. We held a very successful Basement Sale.
- 8. Sederstrom Hall is being offered to outside organizations at a fee. One of the first events will be in March 2017. This event could earn \$1000 and could result in a quarterly event.

Letter to the Bethesda Congregation from the Bethesda Church Council.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

At our February 7, 2016 Annual Budget Meeting it was moved that the council appoint a 60-day deficit task force consisting of five members of the congregation that would give its recommendations back to the council for its action. That task force was formed and their recommendations were brought to the council for action.

The recommendations were as follows:

#### April 2016 DEFICIT TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATIONS

The recommendations are in two categories.

Hard Points (HP) - These actions should be carried out for the reduction of the deficit.

Soft Points (SP) - These actions may be carried out as they have merit in reducing the deficit.

- 1. Refinance Mortgage for lower interest rate.
  - a. HP a Lower interest rates could result in \$5,000 \$17,000 in savings a year depending on percentage point reduction.

- Use social media (Facebook) for specific event or item. Using FB the expanded social group could be used to generate donations.
- 10. SP Online giving verses Mobile giving. Look into switching into a different method for electronic giving. With cell and iPhones ability increasing it may have an improved success in providing opportunities for giving opportunities.

Here are the actions we are taking at this time.

1. On July 24, 2016, in a Special Congregational Meeting it was voted unanimously to transfer our existing mortgage from ELCA Mission Investment Fund (MIF) to Thrivent in order to reduce the interest rate from 5.125% to approximately 3% on a 20-year mortgage with a 5-year ARM.

A lower interest rate will definitely help in reducing the deficit. We encourage the congregation to continue with their giving to the mortgage reduction and general fund.

- 2. Gary is working on refining designated and undesignated me
- 3. We are still searching for a youth director. We are absolutely thrilled that Beth McCabe is doing that job for the summer. She is busy connecting and developing relationships that will strengthen and increase the youth ministry. She is working with the youth during Wednesday night Bible study. She is the chairperson for VBS.
  - 4. The SALT groups are in the planning stage with the God's Contagious Love items.
- 5. Under the land management item, a team has been formed with Dave Hohle, Chet DeSchane, and Nathan Schussler to pursue the ideas and possibilities for the land development questions.
