"God's Contagious Love"

Dear Bethesda Family and Friends,



For we cannot keep from speaking about what we have seen and heard."

Acts 4:20

God's love is so amazing, so profound that it cannot be contained! It touches our hearts and lives in ways that impact and transform how we see and understand life's challenges and joys. That's the reason we are called and invited to pass this amazing message on to others.

Just last week my siblings and their families gathered to surround my 87 year old Mom as she deals with the latest challenge in her life. She received a recent diagnosis of esophageal cancer. She is still undergoing tests to determine specifically what she is dealing with and what the best options are as she considers treatment and going forward from here. Mom expressed it quite well when she said, "I just never thought I would be facing this now at my age."

Needless to say, we are all questioning and wondering . . . "What specifically are we dealing with? Why now? What are Mom's choices going forward? How can we be most helpful and supportive? How can we together manage what is yet to come? These questions and many more are still ahead of us as a family and I know that many of you in our Bethesda family have been down this road before or are facing health challenges at this very moment. It is difficult, and at times overwhelming as it threatens to bring out the both the best and the worst in each of us.

Last week 25 family members gathered together around Mom in love and support amidst the uncertainty that lies ahead. We did what we seem to know best . . . we shared a meal and storytelling that is part of all our gatherings. We offered prayers along with heartfelt affirmations of Mom for who she is in each of our lives.

Without even realizing it we shared something more. In the days after that gathering, nine people from my extended family came down with a rather nasty flu bug. Cathy and I were both casualties to this fast spreading bug. It has been very contagious and frustrating as it impacts our ability and energy level for the circumstances we are now facing together with Mom. I know that it frustrates me as it zaps my energy and stops me from doing things the way I normally can. But it has also forced me to slow down and as a result take time to think and ponder some of what lies ahead. It has caused me to literally stop and contemplate the gift my family is and to realize that I also have an extended church family, a community that I cherish and count on for loving support in times just like this.

What I have discovered this time around is that as much as a flu bug is contagious, the gift of God's love expressed within a community of faith is even more contagious in wonderful ways. Thank you Bethesda for the ways in which you remind me of the gift of God's grace that is

surprising every day . . that is easy to overlook until we find ourselves in challenging places and then when it gets difficult, we need reminders of just how powerful God's love really is! Thank you for your hugs, your prayers, your encouragement and your support especially as we all live into some of the uncertainties of the future. Thank you for the ways in which you express *God's Contarious Love* that are tangible and real.

As we continue this journey of faith I hope and pray that you are discovering more and more of what God is calling you to be about. What kind of contagious life is God calling you to? What kind of challenges, perhaps even trials, is God using to bring about your transformation? Will you trust God to bring you through it? May you be willing to follow where ever God leads you, knowing that nothing can hold back the infectious power of Christ's love! And may we as a community always be willing to share the love and support needed to deal with life in all its complexities.
